Diploma Policy

(critical thinking • judgment • expressive skills)

DP3: is able to draw from across the humanities and social sciences when confronting and solving real world problems, based on the breadth of introductory, intermediate, and advanced level Concentration Courses taken across the interdisciplinary curriculum. (subjectivity • diversity • collaboration)
